SUBJECT: DISCUSSION/ACTION: REPUBLIC SERVICES GREEN WASTE/ORGANIC RECYCLING FOR COMMERCIAL AND SELECT MULTI-FAMILY UNITS RATE INCREASE

1. Approval of Rate increase due to mandatory organics recycle law (AB1826)

DEPARTMENT INVOLVED:

BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:

The State of California has made organic recycling mandatory. The signing of AB1826 into law, has made organics recycling mandatory for certain commercial and multi-family operations. During April 2016, AB 1826 began requiring that certain operations recycle their organic waste. The goal of the mandatory organics recycling law (AB 1826) is to help California achieve aggressive increased recycling and greenhouse gas emission reductions goals. IVRMA, Republic Services, and City Staff have been promoting the mandate and meeting with businesses. The City adopted Ordinance 811 in efforts to become compliant with the AB 1826. The fee imposed by Republic Services for the commercial businesses and multi-family operations is \$45 monthly, low enough to encourage participation but still provide some cost recovery.

RE: Update Resolution for SB 1383 - CalRecycle- City of Imperial

We have submitted a previous memo stating the cost of recycling organics will be implemented in a twophase approach in order to determine the most economically viable solution for our franchise cities and it's residents and to encourage participation in the CalRecycle state mandated program. Per your request, we are submitting a more detailed memo outlining our costs structure for this recycling program. As before, we have focused on: Labor, transportation, contamination charges and equipment operating expenses.

^{*} Note: the \$95.30 is a current estimate of cost per ton based on the program as we have determined the tasks at this time. However, as mentioned, we are initially starting the program with a \$45 per ton rate to encourage participation and to determine what the actual processing cost are as we roll out the program to the community.

Our goal is to provide a solution, get participation and to evaluate the most economical way to comply with the state's recycling program. So in recognizing this, we are initialing proposing to subsidize the program until we have better, more detailed information on processing organics.
