BACKGROUND/SUMMARY:

The Community Development Department was directed by City Council per Resolution 2024-10 (CC04-03-24) to submit an application requesting Federal Funds of the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) Improvement Program for the construction of new segments of PCC sidewalk, as well as the removal and replacement of three (3) handicap curb returns currently in poor conditions.

Afterwards, staff secured funds for \$150,000 composed from \$132,000 of said Federal Funds plus \$18,000 of Local Match (11.47% as stipulated in the application), and also worked on the preparation of the required improvement plans.

Now the Community Development Department is requesting City Council to adopt the plans and specifications prepared for this project and the authorization to seek bids from qualified contractors thru a competitive BID process for the construction of the project as illustrated in the Exhibit A, attached herewith, for details.

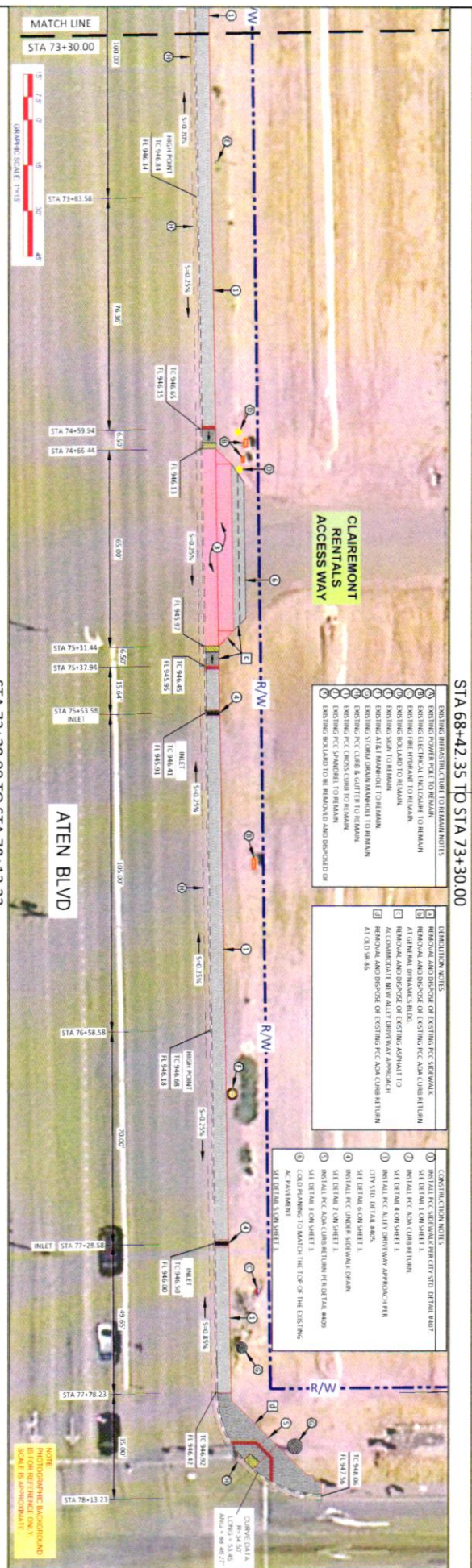
